Pre-Teen Immunization Awareness

Families can give their adolescent a healthy start by scheduling a pre-teen doctor visit and getting their child immunized.

All 11- and 12-year-olds should receive the meningococcal vaccine, which protects against meningitis and its complications; and the Tdap vaccine, a booster against tetanus and diphtheria that also offers protection against pertussis or "whooping cough." Additionally, all 11- and 12-year-old girls should receive the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine, which protects against the most common types of cervical cancer.
